Chairman Longoria commenced the hearing to consider the Houston Pilots' application to the Pilot Board for a change in the pilotage rates effective January 1, 2014. She noted the hearing rate schedule was provided in the public meeting book and available on the Pilot Board website, reviewed the timeline, and discussed public comments, oral presentations, and written rebuttal procedures and deadlines.

Summary Recommendation:

Commence a hearing to consider the Houston Pilots' application to the Pilot Board for a change in pilotage rates effective January 1, 2014.

Background:

The Houston Pilots Licensing and Regulatory Act, Chapter 66 of the Texas Transportation Code (the "Act"), requires the Board of Pilot Commissioners for the Ports of Harris County (the "Pilot Board") to establish pilotage rates for the Ports of Harris County, as provided therein.

By letter dated September 16, 2013, the Houston Pilots (the "Pilots") submitted an application to the Pilot Board for a change in such pilotage rates (the "Application").

The Pilots have proposed (i) overall pilotage rate increases of three and one-half percent (3.5%), to be effective January 1, 2014, (ii) extending the "Pilot Away" grace period by 5 minutes to 35 minutes from first line "on a revenue neutral basis," (iii) adjusting cancellation charges to exclude "automatics," (iv) adding \$7 to the transportation charge to retroactively recover pilot boat increased fuel costs pursuant to the fuel factor formula, and (v) extending promotional discounts at Bayport Terminal for large cruise ships and container ships, all as set forth in the Application.

On September 24, 2013, the Pilot Board set a date to commence a hearing on such Application, i.e. the regularly scheduled Pilot Board meeting of October 22, 2013.

Staff understands that prior to the date of the hearing the Pilots gave notice of the hearing as required by Section 66.062 of the Act, and submitted to the Pilot Board information as required by Section 66.063 of the Act.

Staff Evaluation/Justification:

Section 9 of the Rules and Regulations Governing Pilots and Pilotage on the Houston Ship Channel between the Galveston Bar and Turning Basin adopted by the Pilot Board in July 2013 set forth the Pilot Board's procedures for the establishment of pilotage rates.

In accordance with those procedures, staff anticipates that the Pilot Board's consideration of the Pilot's application will commence upon October 22, 2013, and such hearing will be continued to permit participation by interested parties in connection with Pilot Board action on the Application. The proposed schedule and certain additional rules for such procedures are attached.

Full Recommendation:

The Pilot Board of Commissioners, at its October 22, 2013 meeting, commence a hearing to consider the Houston Pilots' application to the Pilot Board for a change in pilotage rates effective January 1, 2014, and further authorize the Secretary of the Pilot Board to do any and all things in his opinion reasonable or necessary to give effect to the foregoing.

Fall 2013 Houston Pilot Rate Application Additional Procedural Rules

- 1. Written materials submitted to the Secretary shall be provided to members of the Pilot Board no later than five (5) days after receipt.
- 2. The Pilot Board shall give at least ten (10) days' notice before it may adopt a change in pilot rates (Texas Transportation Code Sec. 66.020).
- 3. Written materials submitted by interested parties shall not exceed twenty (20) pages in length, and shall be limited to addressing the factors set forth in Texas Transportation Code Sec. 66.064.
- 4. No oral presentation by an interested party shall exceed five (5) minutes in length, unless otherwise permitted by the Chairman of the Pilot Board. Oral presentations shall be limited to addressing the factors set forth in Texas Transportation Code Sec. 66.064.
- 5. Rebuttals submitted by interested parties shall not exceed ten (10) pages in length, and shall be limited to addressing issues raised by the previous written submissions and oral presentations.
- 6. This time period, as set forth in Section 9(H) of the "Rules and Regulations Governing Pilots and Pilotage on the Houston Ship Channel between the Galveston Bar and Turning Basin," as adopted by the Pilot Board in July 2013 (the "Rules"), has been adjusted by the Chairman of the Pilot Board pursuant to the authority set forth in Section 9(D) of the Rules.
- 7. Not later than ten (10) days after the hearing is complete, the Pilot Board shall issue its written decision (Texas Transportation Code Sec. 66.065). A rate decision shall state the date on which any change becomes effective (Section 9(J) of the Rules).
- 8. A party aggrieved by a Pilot Board decision and desiring to appeal to a court shall submit a request for reconsideration on or before the fourteenth (14th) day after the rate decision announcement (Section 9(K) of the Rules).
- 9. Section 9(K)(1) of the Rules.

Summary Recommendation:

Background:

Prior authorizing Pilot Board action: Minute No. 2009-1215-53

The Application Review Committee (ARC) of the Pilot Board considers whether applicants meet the statutory and regulatory requirements for pilots on the Houston Ship Channel. Among other things, applicants undergo a physical examination to determine if an applicant is in good mental and physical health in order to perform the duties of pilotage on the Houston Ship Channel, and an investigation including a criminal background check and the applicant's accident history is conducted.

Staff Evaluation/Justification:

Captain Kenneth Jones has applied for renewal of his commission as Branch Pilot for the Galveston Bar and Houston Ship Channel. His application includes continued education training in Basic Azipod Training, Radar Plotting Aids (ARPA), Fatigue, sleep, & medication course, and Radar Observer (recertification) and a renewal request on his behalf from the Houston Pilots and evidence of his ability to enter into a faithful performance bond in the amount of \$25,000 payable to the governor.

After an assessment of his qualifications and the documents filed with his application, the ARC determined that Captain Kenneth Jones meets the requirements of Chapter 66 of the Texas Transportation Code, Houston Pilots Licensing and Regulatory Act, Section 66.041, and the Rules and Regulations governing Pilots and Pilotage on the Houston Ship Channel Between the Galveston Bar and the Turning Basin Terminal.

Accordingly, the ARC respectfully submits to the Pilot Board the application of Captain Kenneth Jones to renew his commission as Branch Pilot for the Galveston Bar and the Houston Ship Channel. Such commission is for a four-year term.

Prior authorizing Pilot Board action: Minute No. 2010-1214-02

The Application Review Committee (ARC) of the Pilot Board considers whether applicants meet the statutory and regulatory requirements for pilots on the Houston Ship Channel. Among other things, applicants undergo a physical examination to determine if an applicant is in good mental and physical health in order to perform the duties of pilotage on the Houston Ship Channel, and an investigation including a criminal background check and the applicant's accident history is conducted.

Staff Evaluation/Justification:

Captain Michael K. Lawson II has applied for commission as Branch Pilot for the Galveston Bar and Houston Ship Channel. Captain Lawson will have successfully completed a three year apprenticeship performing all aspects and duties required of a Branch Pilot. His application includes continued education training in Bridge Resource Management – Pilots, Raven Wheelhouse II AIS Navigation System, Azimuth Stern Dive Tug Handling, Emergency Ship Handling, Legal Aspects of Piloting, and Manned Model Ship Handling and a request on his behalf from the Houston Pilots and evidence of his ability to enter into a faithful performance bond in the amount of \$25,000 payable to the governor.

After an assessment of his qualifications and the documents filed with his application, the ARC determined that Captain Michael K. Lawson II meets the requirements of Chapter 66 of the Texas Transportation Code, Houston Pilots Licensing and Regulatory Act, Section 66.033, and the Rules and Regulations governing Pilots and Pilotage on the Houston Ship Channel Between the Galveston Bar and the Turning Basin Terminal.

Accordingly, the ARC respectfully submits to the Pilot Board the application of Captain Michael K. Lawson II for his commission as Branch Pilot for the Galveston Bar and the Houston Ship Channel. Such commission is for a four-year term.

Full Recommendation:

The Pilot Board, at its October 22, 2013 meeting, recommend to the Governor the commission of Captain Michael K.
